## **THE PROGRAMME**

The European Workshop on Applied Cultural Economics is intended to provide a forum for the development and dissemination of applications of quantitative methods in cultural economics, as well as cultural-related applications of mathematical economics, experimental economics and other quantitative approaches.

The workshop will consist of 15-20 papers and the number of participants will be limited to around 25. Each paper will be allocated 45 minutes, made up of a presentation by the authors, followed by a comment from a nominated discussant and a general discussion. Papers will be circulated in advance and taken as read.

## **SELECTION OF PAPERS**

Papers for the 2011 Workshop will be selected on the basis of full drafts. Papers must be sent as e-mail attachments (pdf, word) to Antonello Eugenio Scorcu [antonello.scorcu@unibo.it]. Deadline for submitting completed draft papers: **May 31, 2011**. Authors will be notified regarding acceptance or rejection by **June 15, 2011**.

## **ACCOMODATION AND FEES**

Each presenter is intended to be available to serve as discussant and will be offered some support for three nights lodging (accommodation and meals). They must cover fully their own travel expenses. Other participants and accompanying persons are required to pay an individual fee of €150 to cover administrative costs and meals.
